Content:

- Try to convey a deep, personal meaning not shallow, clichéd references
- Connect your poem to your own life
- Must be school appropriate; no profanity; no silly clichés (yolo, etc.)
- May have an overall theme
- Be as specific and detailed as you can show don't tell

Format:

- A minimum of 10 lines, a maximum of 40 lines
- Do not repeat a verse/line; repeated lines do not count toward the minimum

Other:

- Be creative; don't be repetitive
- Please do not copy lines from Majgani (or any other poet)
- Your target audience members are your colleagues in the other E9H classes, teachers and other poetry café guests
- You will read the poem for the class; likely to be recorded (audio)
